Treasurer's Report - Glenn Lowenstein

This report provides an overview of the financial status of the Houston Geological Society (HGS) as of the end of May 2025.

Executive Summary:

- HGS Total Equity increased (\$18,223) from April 2025 due an increase in Schwab Money Market and investments.
- Budget for the most part HGS has been trending positively on expenses and revenue throughout the fiscal year but in April and May, expenses were 5% to 9% more than budgeted. However, HGS collected more than 15 % to 20% of the budgeted revenue and is still in the Black.

Equity:

Assuming an operating cost of \$30,000/month (approx. average spending per month to date during this fiscal year, reserves in the HGS liquid non-investment bank accounts (Chase checking) for greater than 5 months of expenses.

Revenue and Expenses:

Operating revenues and expenses in May 2025 were as follows:

Majority Revenue - \$6,750 from sponsors (Student Expo & Golf Tournament, General Dinner); \$2,910 (Short courses), \$2,100 (Donations); \$2,025 (Meeting registrations), \$2,240 (Membership Dues) . **Total Revenue =\$15,891.**

Majority Expenses – Payroll - \$6,341, Donations - \$3,365, Legal & Prof - \$2,814, Meeting - \$2,136, Bulletin - \$2,003, Social Events - \$1,616, Website Maintenance - \$1,073 **Total Expenses = \$26,405.**

Net Revenue = <\$10,515>

Comparison of May 2024 to May 2025

Overall increase in Net Revenue in 2025 from 2024 is \$39,095. With both months being in the negative.

Total Revenue: Decreased \$7,765 from 2024.

Biggest impacts: Sponsors and publication royalties were down from 2024.

Total Expenses: Decrease of \$39,042 from 2024 compared to 2025.

Biggest Impacts: Donations expenses (\$22,702) were significantly down; followed by the Grand Canyon outfitters down-payment (\$14,500) not seen in 2025; meeting expenses were down \$6,295 and office insurance decreased in 2025 by \$3,050; Social event expenses decreased in 2025 by \$2,370.
